This year the Seattle Police Athletic Association Pistol Team will be hosting the Washington State Police Pistol Combat Championships at the Seattle Police Athletic Association Range facility located at 11030 E. Marginal Way S. in Seattle. This event has been held annually within the State of Washington since 1975 and is one of the highlights of the NRA Sanctioned PPC season in Washington State.

The match program is attached along with a schedule of events and a pre-entry form for your use. **Note:** There **will be** a warm-up match conducted on Friday July 10, 2009. The warm-up will be run starting at 1 PM and will consist of the PPC match: One for the Revolver and One for the Semi-Auto. The entry fee will be \$5.00 for each match fired. Scores submitted will be used for warm-up match awards. We will have open range practice beginning at 9 AM on Friday and turning targets will be available during open range practice.

Entry fees for the State Championship will include a Saturday evening Banquet with a home-cooked Meat and Potatoes Dinner, salad and including Beverage and Dessert. We will have an awards ceremony including the distribution of the 2008 Washington State Governor's 20 Awards at that time as well as the awards for the Duty Gun and Revolver portions of the State Championship.

Every effort has been made to keep the costs reasonable, and you will note that the fee schedule includes a single entry fee for both the 1500 revolver and 1500 auto combined. (Although a shooter may fire both matches) NRA Fees reflect firing of both 1500's.

We will be offering a Civilian Match for those who do not qualify under the NRA eligibility rules for PPC. That match will be fired as a full 1500 with a separate relay on Saturday and will have an entry fee of \$20 with prizes awarded for the top three shooters. (Entry fee includes the Banquet). We will be running a Civilian equivalent "WSPPA Duty Gun" Relay on Saturday for those interested and the fee will be \$7.00 for that match.

We encourage you to utilize the pre-entry form provided and send it to the address indicated. Registration will open at 0730 Hours each day and the matches will begin at 9:00 am sharp.

Rules: Current NRA Police Pistol Combat rules for registered tournament will apply.

Eligibility: Competitors must be eligible to compete per NRA rules 2.1, or 2.1.1 and 2.4. Eligibility authentication will be required as per NRA rule 2.4.1. Shooters must provide appropriate law enforcement identification and NRA classification cards or temporary score books when registering or picking up squadding tickets.

Note: NRA Membership (or equivalent Canadian) is required to participate in the Regional Match. NRA Membership applications will be available at the Range.

Squadding: All matches will be squadded with the exception of Team matches. Squadding tickets for individual matches will be issued from the statistical office and will be available at the time of registration. Those individuals pre-registered will be able to pick up squadding tickets the day prior to or the morning of the match. Squadding will be in accordance with the shooters most recent/current classification. A competitor, who fails to obtain his squadding ticket or to present himself at a proper firing point when his relay is called, may lose his right to compete in that event.

Classification:

a) Individuals will be classified within six (6) classes per NRA Rules section 19: High Master, Master, Expert, Sharpshooter, Marksman and Classified. Classification will be based on NRA Police Combat classification, the scores for which are taken from NRA sanctioned Police Pistol Combat matches or registered leagues. Unclassified competitors, without a temporary score book, are required to compete in the High Master Class (NRA rule 19.2).

b) Team matches will not be classified. Teams will not be divided into the five categories for award distribution.

c) Insufficient entries in a class May require those competitors to be moved by the Match Director to the next higher class as per NRA Rule 19.8. (Every effort will be made to provide awards for each class. See Awards Section)

Categories: There will be no category breakdowns for this State Championship.

Challenges: A challenge fee of \$1.00 will be charged for each challenge made. NRA rules Section 16.

Arms Allowed: Per NRA Rules see section 3 Equipment and Ammunition, Rule 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4, 3.5 and 3.7 for the respective matches.

Ammunition: Either hand or factory loaded ammunition, .32 caliber or larger, may be used. No high speed or magnum ammunition will be allowed. See NRA rule 3.17.

- Firing Method:** D.A. will designate matches that will be fired double action. S.A. will designate matches that can be fired either single or double action.
- Loading:** All loading will be with cartridges taken from the competitor's pocket, cartridge belt, mechanical loaders or special pouch. Cartridge belts and special pouches may be used if they are practical for police duty use. It is the competitor's responsibility to have sufficient ammunition in his possession to complete the event/match. If the equipment to be used is questionable, it should be submitted to the Match director for decision prior to the firing of the first match. **All loading will be with six cartridges.** Time for reloading is included in the time limit for each match or stage.
- Time:** Time will be as shown for each match or stage. Time will start with loaded gun in the holster. No part of the competitor's hand may touch the gun or holster until the command to commence firing is given.
- Optical Devices:** No optical devices (other than normal glasses for corrective eyesight purposes or sunglasses) will be permitted on the range during match firing for the use by competitors. Optical devices have also been interpreted to prohibit the use of a mechanical iris, eye patch or eye cover. Only open sights will be allowed. Optical, mirror, telescopic, laser beam, electronically projected dots, etc., computerized sighting-aiming devices are prohibited. Any device programmed to activate the firing mechanism by other than conventional trigger movement is prohibited. (For team Coaches during team match, see Rules 12.5 and 12.6).
- Holsters:** Holsters will be in accordance with NRA rule 3.12. Conventional right- or left-handed holster must be used. For safety reasons, shoulder, cross draw, or holsters with require releasing by insertion of finger within the trigger guard will not be allowed. Semi-automatic pistol holsters must completely cover the trigger. This rule shall apply to all matches and tournaments fired pursuant to these rules.
- Targets:** NRA Approved NRA B-27 targets will be used. Hits on the 7,8,9,and 10 scoring areas will be used.
- Sighting shots:** No sighting shots will be allowed.
- Refires:** No refires will be allowed for defective guns, ammunition or other malfunctions of the shooter's equipment. Competitors may clear jams or malfunctions provided all safety requirements are met. Refiring will be authorized in accordance with revisions to NRA Rule 9.16.
- Target Handling:** A competitor will be responsible for picking up new targets when entering the range, for going forward on command to mount the target, fill in the legend, and sign his name.
- Scoring:** At the end of firing for each match, competitors will move to the scoring area. Competitors will score the number of hits, by value on the target and enter in the appropriate scoring area on the score card. All scoring will be done by competitors. The use of plug type scoring gauges will be restricted to use by the scoring officers or referee. Competitors will score the target of the shooter to their right. Competitors will move back to their own target, check target and score card for correctness and sign their score card to indicate acceptance of the score. If the competitor does not accept the score, the competitor must contact the referee and post a challenge per NRA rule 16.1. If the score is accepted, scores will be checked by the statistical office and posted on the bulletin board. Competitors must sign score cards or risk not having scores accepted.
- Breaking Ties:** When two or more competitors have the same numerical score, scores will be ranked according to NRA rule 15.11.

 6 shots standing right hand with support ---- 90 seconds
- Match 3:** 50 yards (sitting, prone, standing)-S.A. or D.A.
 6 shots sitting
 6 shots prone
 6 shots standing left hand with support
 6 shots standing right hand with support ---- 2 minutes & 45 seconds
- Match 4:** 25 yards (standing without support)-D.A.
 Stage 1: 12 shots----- 35 seconds
 Stage 2: 12 shots----- 35 seconds

Match 5: NRA National Police Course:

- Stage 1:** (a) 7 yards-12 shots standing without support --- 20 seconds
(b) 25 yards (kneeling and standing)-D.A.
6 shots kneeling

- Stage 2:** (a) 50 yards (sitting, prone, standing) S.A. or D.A.
6 shots sitting
6 shots prone
6 shots standing left hand with support
6 shots standing right hand with support ----- 2 minutes & 45 seconds
- Stage 2:** (b) 25 yards (standing without support) D.A.
6 shots ----- 12 seconds

Match 6: Aggregate of Matches 1,2,3,4,5 (revolver and semi-auto)

Match7: Semi-Auto 1500 Match-----Sunday July 12, 2009

Semi-auto Per NRA Rule 3.3

Course-of-Fire same as above.

Match 8: NRA National Police Course-4 Man Team Match (Revolver and semi-auto). Open to four firing members, one alternate, team captain and team coach representing any police department whose members are eligible to compete under eligibility rule as stated earlier. All individual names must represent the same agency or department. No pickup teams will be allowed. Each shooter will fire the course as stated in Match 5.

Revolver Saturday July 11, 2009

Semi-Auto Sunday July 12, 2009

Match 9: NRA National Police Course 2 Man Team Match (revolver and semi-auto). Open to two firing members, representing any agency eligible according to the eligibility rule as stated earlier. Both members must represent the same agency or department. No pickup teams will be permitted. No individual can shoot both matches 8 & 9. No agency will be allowed to enter more than one team in this match. Course of fire will be as stated in Match 5. Match 8 will be fired concurrently with Match 9.

Revolver Saturday July 11, 2009

Semi-Auto Sunday July 12, 2009

Match 10: Service Revolver Match----- Saturday July 11, 2009

Arm allowed per NRA Rule 3.5. Must be D.A. capable. Barrel length not to exceed 4". Ammunition allowed: 38 SPL 158 Grain lead round nose or semi-wadcutter.

- Stage 1:** 3 Yards, D.A., 6 shots one hand, from standing without support position, 8 Seconds.
- Stage 2:** 7 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.
- Stage 3:** 15 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.
- Stage 4:** 25 Yards, D.A., 18 shots, one or two hands, 6 shots kneeling, using the barricade for cover and support; 6 shots standing left hand from behind the barricade; 6 shots standing right hand from behind the barricade. 90 seconds, includes reloading for subsequent 6 shot strings.

Match 11: Off-Duty Sidearm Match-----Saturday July 11, 2009

Note: Officers have the choice to compete using a revolver or semi-automatic pistol meeting Rule 3.6 or 3.8. If you compete with a semi-automatic pistol, then your semi-automatic pistol classification will be used. If you compete with a revolver, then your revolver classification will be used. Barrel length not to exceed 2 3/4" (Revolver) or 3.65" (semi-auto). Ammunition allowed: 38 SPL 158 Grain lead round nose or semi-wadcutter (revolvers). .35 cal or larger for Semi-auto pistols.

- Stage 1:** 3 Yards, D.A., 6 shots one hand, from standing without support position, 8 Seconds.
- Stage 2:** 7 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.

- Stage 3:** 15 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.
- Stage 4:** 25 Yards, D.A., 18 shots, one or two hands, 6 shots kneeling, using the barricade for cover and support; 6 shots standing left hand from behind the barricade; 6 shots standing right hand from behind the barricade. 90 seconds, includes reloading for subsequent 6 shot strings.

Match 12: WSPPA Duty Gun Match -----Saturday July 11, 2009

All stages will start with a loaded gun in the holster or in the low and ready position at stage two. Only two commands to load will be given, at the beginning of stage one and at the beginning of stage 4, after the target change. During the firing of the course, standards of a **Live Range** will apply. The course will be fired on the NRA B-27 target using the standard scoring rings. The match will consist of 48 rounds, 480-48X maximum possible score. **This course is restricted to standard duty class handguns either revolver or semi-automatic. Duty class ammunition, either factory or equivalent reloads, will be used. All holsters, belts and spare ammunition pouched will be of standard uniform configuration. The Match Director will make all equipment evaluations and his decision will be final.**

Course of fire as follows:

- Stage 1:** 5 yards D.A.-draw and fire 3 rounds in 3 seconds, holster and repeat on command-----6 rounds total
- Stage 2:** 7 yards D.A.-Beginning at the low ready position, fire 2 rounds standing in 2 seconds, repeat 2 times on command -----6 rounds total
- Stage 3:** 15 yards D.A.-draw and fire 12 rounds in 20 seconds, 1 mandatory reload-----12 rounds total
- Target change:**
- Stage 4:** 25 yards D.A.-draw and fire
6 rounds kneeling
6 rounds standing left side of barricade with support
6 rounds standing right side of barricade with support...**time 60 seconds**-----18 rounds total
- Stage 5:** 7 yards D.A.-draw and fire 6 rounds in 6 seconds -----6 rounds total

Match 13: Stock Semi-Auto Match-----Sunday July 12, 2009

Semi-auto Per NRA Rule 3.7

- Stage 1:** 3 Yards, D.A., 6 shots one hand, from standing without support position, 8 Seconds.
- Stage 2:** 7 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.
- Stage 3:** 15 Yards, D.A., 12 shots, one or two hands, from standing without support position. 20 seconds, includes reloading for second 6 shot string.
- Stage 4:** 25 Yards, D.A., 18 shots, one or two hands, 6 shots kneeling, using the barricade for cover and support; 6 shots standing left hand from behind the barricade; 6 shots standing right hand from behind the barricade. 90 seconds, includes reloading for subsequent 6 shot strings.

Match 14: Distinguished Revolver Match-----Saturday July 11, 2009

Note: Firearm per NRA Rule 3.1 barrel not to exceed 6". Ammunition allowed: **Factory loaded** 38 SPL 158 Grain Lead Round Nose or Semi-Wadcutter. Triggers must be weighed prior to firing this match (2.5 LB S.A.) and ammunition inspected prior to entering firing range for this match. Course of fire will be as stated in Match 5 (PPC)

Match 15: Distinguished Semi-Auto Match-----Sunday July 12, 2009

Note: Firearm per NRA Rule 3.4. Maximum sight radius not more than 7.5", minimum trigger pull not less than 3.5 LB single action. Ammunition: Factory loaded .35 Cal. or larger. Triggers must be weighed prior to firing this match and ammunition inspected prior to entering firing range for this match. Course-of-fire will be as stated in Match 5 (PPC)

Awards Schedule: All awards will be trophies, NRA points and/or merchandise as provided by the sponsor and the NRA. An award will be presented to the winner in each class (min. of 5 competitors at the sponsor's option, where there are less than 5 competitors in a class, sponsor may offer a reduced award). A competitor may only receive one award per event. Awards will be as follows:

State Championships:

- Individual matches (1-5): Match winner (regardless of class) first in each class minimum. (Revolver and semi-auto)
- Match 6 (aggregate of 1-5): Washington State Champion (regardless of class) "*Andy Shrode Memorial Trophy*" (Revolver and semi-auto) first in each class minimum.
- High Washington Shooter- match 6/7
- High Canadian Shooter-match 6/7
- Two man Team (revolver and semi-auto)
- Four man Team (revolver and semi-auto)
- Service Revolver match
- Duty Gun Championship
- Stock Semi-Auto match
